Nancy Bushika called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., opened with the Pledge of Allegiance, welcomed everyone, and read a statement with procedural rules for the meeting. There were no changes to the agenda or its order.

### **BUDGET WORK SESSION**

The Selectboard reviewed the town and highway budgets. They discussed the mowing and sheriff's patrols. Mike Denault reminded residents to call 911 in an emergency, not the Bennington sheriff. Tyna Senecal liked the Selectboard's decision to use the ARPA funds in a way that will benefit all taxpayers. The board debated putting money into the highway equipment reserve fund. The Finance Committee provided great insight on the budget which prompted the Selectboard to reduce it by approximately \$10,000.00.

# MUNICIPAL OPTION TO ENACT A MASK MANDATE IN PUBLIC PLACES

MOTION by Dan Potvin that the Town of Stamford will not mandate mask-wearing in town. SECONDED by Mike Denault. All in favor. Motion APPROVED.

1. Dan Potvin has information on alternative medicine and natural remedies for anyone who has second thoughts after receiving the vaccine or has COVID-19. Carolyn Brooks asked if it is within the purview of the Selectboard to dispense medical advice. Mike Denault said he is just offering information. 3. Dan Potvin said he is organizing a 5K race near the end of April. More information will be available soon.

4. The federal government has created a webpage: covidtests.gov, where every household can sign up to receive four free home rapid test kits. No personal information is needed, just the homeowner's name and mailing address. The requirement to submit Nominating Petitions to run for an elected office is waived along with the requirement to obtain signatures of 1% of the registered voters. A Consent of Candidate form will be required to run for an elected office and the deadline to file the Consent is Monday, January 24, 2022 by 5:00 p.m. A Consent of Candidate form may be picked up at the Town Office. V.S.A. 17:2681(a) (b).
